We are so excited to be welcoming all of the students who are returning next week. By now, you should have been contacted by your child's classroom teacher with the details of your child's schedule. If you have any questions about your child's return to school this week, please call the office at any time. Please read today's Cyclone News carefully as we have lots of important info. to share about the big week ahead!

A few things to keep in mind for returning students:

1. **Daily Health Check** – A Daily Health Check is to be completed with your child before each school day. Children **MUST** stay home if they have any of the suggested symptoms. We appreciate your support in this as we strive to maintain a safe and healthy environment for all. See Student Health Check details below.
2. **Essential Service Worker families** – In order for your child to attend school Monday – Friday (when you are working) you must complete the online survey on the NLPS website and register centrally. Once registered and accepted, you will be notified by the school.
3. **Arrival** in the mornings – Please have your child arrive as close to the 8:30am start time as possible.
4. Students will **line up** at their regular classroom entry door. (except Mr. Hocker's class – please line up at main office entry door.
5. Please talk with your child about **school being a 'bit different'** in these coming weeks. There will be less of their friends in class each day. We will also be reviewing all the safety protocols and practices regularly.
6. As noted in the Parent Bulletin, **only staff and students are permitted in the building**—parents must remain outside and maintain physical distancing.

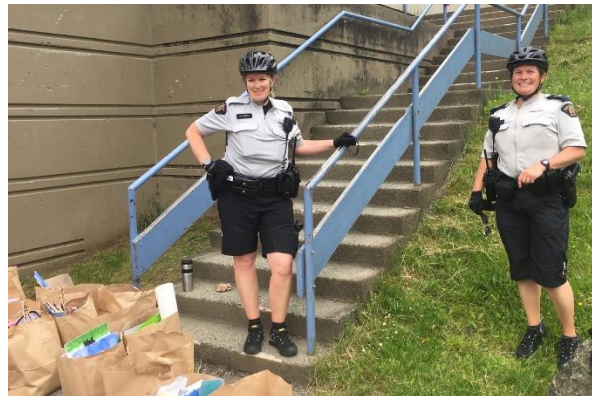

STUDENT PLACEMENT FOR CLASSES IN 2020 - 2021

At this time of the year, we start to plan for the 2020 - 21 school year. The assignment of students into divisions involves careful planning by staff to ensure the best possible placement of each student. We are in the process of planning the next academic year with the school team to build classes, which suit the students' academic and social needs. We take a lot of care in doing classroom composition for each grade. We make up each class list in a way that maximizes the quality of teaching and learning conditions for all students. The decision for placement is based on many factors, such as balancing academic ability, levels of independence, learning styles, social/emotional maturity, and maximizing the positive learning environment for the whole class. The classroom composition for each grade has to reflect the acceptance of all individuals within an inclusive school as we attempt to provide appropriate educational programming to all children. If you have specific educational information, that you would like us to consider about your child, please contact Mrs. Wood (in writing) **no later than June 5**. We do consider requests, along with all other pertinent information provided by classroom teachers and support staff. Please note that requests are considered but we do not guarantee they can be honoured. Also, as teachers may change schools and grade groupings are dependent on our enrolment numbers and balancing learning needs, ***please describe optimal learning environments without referring to specific teachers. We are not able to take requests for individual teachers.***

Student Health Check

Does your child have any of these symptoms?
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High temperature (≥ 37.5 °C)

Cough (dry or productive)

Loss of appetite

Chills

Nasal congestion

Sore muscles

Runny nose/sneezing

Sore throat/hoarseness

Wheezing

Shortness of breath/difficulty

Diarrhea

Vomiting
